That said, some groups do not strictly adhere to continental divisions. For example, the Middle East and North Africa are separated from sub-Saharan Africa along cultural lines. Similarly, the Caribbean and Central America are grouped separately from North and South America due to latitude-based similarities. There are 27 countries in Asia and it is the largest and most popular region in the world, with about 60 percent of the world's population living there. The region boasts five of the world's 10 most democratic countries, with India and China occupying the top two positions. Their inclusion is based on culture. Turkey is also sometimes placed on the list of Asian and European countries because geographically it is between both. In the last 50 years of the 20th century, due to declining mortality and high birth rates, the region grew faster than any other region in the world. As of 2018, data shows that about three-quarter of the population lives in urban areas. Mount Aconcagua, located in the Andes mountains in Argentina near Chile is the highest point in the Western Hemisphere. At an altitude of 131 feet (40 meters) below sea level, the Valdés Peninsula, located in southeastern Argentina, is the lowest point of the hemisphere. Most countries in sub-Saharan Africa gained independence between the 1960s and 1980s, so their economies and infrastructure are still growing. This is proving the hardest for countries that are banned from land due to the extra barriers in transport and the way they must pass to get their goods to and from the port.
